Board of Directors Meeting - January Minutes

The January 2005 meeting of the Board of Directors for the South Jersey Region of the Sports Car Club of America, Inc. was held at the home of David Hess on Wednesday evening, January 5, 2005. The meeting was called to order by R.E., J.D. King at 8:25 PM.

Present were: David Hess, Meg Meyer, Jim Wakeman, Jack Oliver, John Borden, Sue King and J.D. King.

Banquet - J.D. has been in touch with Hankook about having one of their reps be present at the banquet. J.D. has been gathering goodies for giveaways at the banquet. John will finalize the menu with the folks at Fontana's. Grace will take care of the Solo II awards and J.D. and Tom Smith will be in charge of all the other awards.

Solo II - After many attempts and telephone calls, J.D. thinks he has finally reached the person who is responsible for granting us dates for Camden. John suggested that we get as many dates as we can just don't commit - we can always cancel if there is a big conflict with other clubs. We should also schedule dates with Atco. Sue suggested that we put out a schedule of dates with a disclaimer that the schedule is subject to change. John stressed that we should keep going with Camden and get as many dates as we can and then produce a schedule.

Vintage Gran Prix - Sue reported that she attended a meeting earlier today with the formation committee. This event is scheduled for Mother's Day weekend in Camden and will be run along the waterfront between the baseball stadium and the aquarium. They have a lot of work to be com-

pleted if this event is going to come to fruition. This is a two day event and the committee expects a crowd of about 50,000 people. The layout of the course has not been completed. We will need to know the layout so that we can provide sufficient workers to man the corners. They do not need personnel for timing and scoring. They will need tech inspectors. Meg suggested that we put the date for this event up on our website and the board agreed.

Web Site - Meg reported that she has received a bill from our current web host and we will need to work something out with them as we are now about two months into our contract with them for the domain name. Meg found a potential new host - Superb Hosting.com - they have five databases that are free and she feels they are a little more advanced. It would cost \$90.00 - \$7.50 a month -

Heartland Park in 2006

In 2006, Solo II competitors won't be the only ones traveling to Kansas for the end of the year championships.

Steve Johnson has just announced that the road racing Runoffs will be moved to Heartland Park in 2006 for a three-year period. Heartland Park will be the first track west of the Mississippi River to host the Runoffs since 1968. Improvements in the Heartland Park facility scheduled prior to the National Championship Runoffs include new road course garages, a road course control tower and timing facility, expansion of the current paddock to accommodate 1000 participants, new camping and parking areas, additional concessions, spectator viewing areas, and a complete repaving of the circuit, as well as a number of changes to the track layout.

The date for the 2006 Runoffs has not yet been announced. The 2005 SCCA

National Championship Runoffs presented by Kohler will be held September 19-25 at Mid-Ohio Sports Car Course in Lexington, Ohio.

NorthEast Division Historic Racing Group

Historic Racing is Alive and Growing in the Northeast Division



Whether you know it or not, your SCCA region has a historic racing program! Early in 2004, the Northeast Division and its 19 Regions agreed to support the formation of the Historic Racing Group (HRG). The HRG is an evolution of what was originally called the Volvo Historic Series, born in the Northern New Jersey Region (NNJR) of SCCA in 1997. After five years of support from Volvo, the series ran without sponsorship in 2002 and 2003, continuing its affiliation with NNJR. In 2004, the series broadened its horizons and was adopted by the Division.

The HRG's philosophy is to provide a fun, low key forum for pre-1974 production-based race cars, without the extremely rigid adherence to originality and pedicure that many of the pure vintage race series demand. There are presently five classes, segregated by engine displacement, with a wide

mix of cars, from Minis and MG's, to BMW's and Porches, and Mustangs, Camaros and Corvettes. HRG cars must conform to current SCCA safety standards, run on DOT-approved tires, and generally comply to the SCCA's Historic GCR. "Neat and clean" appearance is strongly encouraged, while protests are discouraged. The 13/13 rule common to most vintage groups is not used, nor necessary. Drivers with a propensity to use the "chrome horn" are given a chance to voluntarily adjust their attitude. Should they continue in their evil ways, they are not welcomed back.

While fun is the main objective, and car-to-car contact is rare, there is plenty of close competition. The HRG race is often one of the most entertaining groups of the day for the spectators, with the beautiful sight of 30 or more classic sports cars taking the green flag, the exciting thunder of


1960's muscle cars, and David and Goliath battles between Minis and Mustangs.

HRG runs as a separate race group within regional and national SCCA Club Racing events. In 2004, the schedule included eight events with 11 races at six tracks around the northeast. A similar schedule is in the works for 2005, with events planned at Lime Rock, Pocono, NHIS, Beaverun, and Watkins Glen. If you've got an old Production or Vintage car, or even an IT car, sitting in the garage, now's the time to blow the dust off of it, order some new DOT rubber, and get ready to race!
