

South Jersey Region- Sports Car Club of America Road Rally Series Regulations 2008

The Series

The South Jersey Region of the Sports Car Club of America will present ten road rallies during the year 2008. The Series begins in and ends in October. All the rallies will have as a headquarters JG Cooks Bar and Grill in Pitman NJ (except the March Lamb rally). At the end of the year, champion driver and navigator will be declared in each of the six classes list below. Each rally will be dual rallies having both Course and Touring instructions.

Competitor Classes and Equipment Limitations

The two classes for the Touring rally will be:

Stock(S)	Same equipment S below
Combined Equipped/ Limited	Same as E and L below with a .6 handicap multiplier for L

The four classes for the Course rally will be:

Equipped (E)	Unlimited equipment
Limited (L)	Any mileage measuring equipment, and any timekeeping equipment and calculating equipment without direct odometer input.
Stock (S)	Stock odometer in stock location, and any timekeeping equipment and any single memory calculating equipment.
Novice (N)	Same equipment as Stock Class. Total rallies run by the driver and navigator combined not to exceed 20 as of January 2008 or neither entry having run a rally prior to 1/1/2006.

Scoring

Series points will be award to both Driver and Navigator according to the following schedule beginning with first place and continuing through the class. Schedule: 10,8,6,5,4,3,2,1.9,1.8,...etc. In case of a tie for a position, the points for that position shall be awarded equally to each competitor and the contestants following shall be shifted down in position by the number of cars tied. For example, three cars tied for second would receive eight points each and the next placing car would receive the fifth place points. Points will be accrued in the number of rallies that is a lowest whole number that is greater than one half the rallies in the Series during the year.

Examples: (1) Eight Rallies results in Five scores being used ($1/2$ of $8 = 4$; 5 is the lowest whole number greater than 4. (2) Nine Rallies results in Five scores being used ($1/2$ of $9 = 4.5$; 5 is the lowest whole number greater than 4.5). The number of counted of rallies will never exceed five. In addition to the points accrued by a competitor, six (6) workers points will be added to all competitors' scores who work one of the Series rallies. Series competitors are considered to have worked if they were the rally master, a pre-checker, a control worker or a person who performed any other day of event job.

Series Prizes and Awards

There will be trophies for the drivers and navigators in each class who accumulate the most points as defined above in each class. Competitor's yearly score will be the sum of their highest 5 scores. To qualify for an award, the contestant must have participated in at least 5 of the series rallies. Additional awards will be presented as deemed appropriate by the rally committee. If a competitor competes during the series as both a driver and navigator all their points will accrue in the position that they most compete. If equal then all their points will accrue in the position first entered.
